Summer Camp 2019

The Summer Camp organised by the XPTA, started on 21st May 2019 in the campus of St. Xavier's High School. Professional Development Programme

On 17th June, 'Professional Development Programme' session was held at St. Xavier's High School for the Primary teachers. The Resource Persons for the session were Mrs Bhagwanti Gupta and Mr Charles. They discussed various innovative techniques through different games to attract the attention and the concentration of the learners. These techniques, if introduced in the classroom, would prepare the children to take the inputs and make learning last longer. The second part of the session focused on developing proficiency in communication. The learners must enhance the most important skills of language-Listening, Speaking, Writing and Thinking to make them competent so that they can face the challenges of the world.
