Interview with |

Fr. A. Christu Savarirajan, SJ, Principal

1. Father you have been in our Xavier family for about two years. Please share your experiences with us.

More enriching. Children bring lots of joy to me. I have experienced a lot of love, care and cooperation from the teachers.

2. Father, tell us something about your school life. Your favorite subject, your favorite book and about student life.

My schooling took place in four schools. That exposed me to different learning environments. I earned more friends. Participation in all kinds of competitions gave me avenues to discover my innate potentials. I would eagerly wait for such competitions and I would get prize in every one of them. A significant feature of my school was my regular visits to the school library. I used to read a lot of books and even now I have kept up that habit.

3. You had gone abroad for your higher education. Tell us something about foreign education system

During my studies in Boston College I realized that knowledge is power. Knowledge empowers you. The more knowledgeable you are the more recognition you get. Secondly be original in your thought and work and never copy others' works. I discovered that teachers and professors play a role of mentors and guides. They never spoon-feed you. Thus you have to work independently and bring your knowledge to the classroom. Knowledge gained by self-learning becomes a great treasure.

4. What are your expectations from students, teachers and staff of this institution?

I want my teachers and students to be creative learners. Don't be satisfied with minimum. The more you learn creatively

the more you deliver innovatively. This can happen only when you have a thirst and hunger for knowledge. I also want my teachers to be skillful. They need to be good mentors who can accompany the students with proper guidance and compassion. The teachers and students must compete with oneself and compete with the world outside. Until one feels of himself or herself capable he or she must constantly search the ways to equip with skills.

5. Do you think that the involvement of school with the community is important? Why?

The school considers involvement with the community outside very important. I strongly believe that students must keep themselves abreast with the social realities. The social inequalities that they see in the society outside must disturb their conscience. Keeping that in view, we plan to have outreach programmes where students will be taken to some Social Centers, Homes for the aged, orphanages, etc. so that they can contribute their lot in the future.

6. Father as the Principal of our school you have to shoulder many responsibilities. How do you manage to do this difficult task? What sort of hurdles you have to overcome?

When talking about leadership qualities Pope Francis talks about three ways of leading- Lead from the front, lead from the middle and lead from behind. When I lead from the front I give a right direction; when I lead from the middle I encourage and boost up the morale of people and when I lead

from behind I ensure that no one is left behind. This approach gives me a lot of insight to carry out my responsibilities with utmost care. I am consciously aware of the people who are entrusted to my care.

7. Teachers are like candles who light the lives of students. What according to you are the characteristics of an excellent teacher?

Welcome change in the classroom. They need to think out of the box. They need to be comfortable with the unknown. Such an attitude will help them to take risk in their teaching endeavors. Teachers must also listen to the creative ideas of students and give shape to them. The more we honor their views the more lively the classroom becomes.

8. According to you how an ideal Xavierian should be?

An ideal Xavierian always must engrave the motto of the school on his or her heart- "For God and Country". It is this motto that should be the fulcrum of one's life.

9. Finally what are your expectations from the outgoing batch?

I posed a question to the outgoing batch on their farewell day - "Are you ready?" The school makes a conscious effort in making its students fully equipped with the wherewithal to face the outside world. The students must exude this confidence when they graduate from St. Xavier's. Secondly, my advice to the outgoing batch is "Be trendsetters". The world must look up to you.

Interview with Fr. Devashish Prasad, S.J., Vice Principal



1. Father we welcome you to our Xavier Family. This being your first interview in our school, all of us are eager to know about your past experiences, education and family?

I did my pastoral ministry at Kurji Parish which has been the largest parish in Bihar for two years before coming to St. Xavier's. There were more than fifteen thousand Christians in this parish. I always helped the people of this parish progress in life. I worked in Ratanpurwa, West Champaran for one year in a rural school. I was at Xavier Nilaya, Bangalore for one year training the young boys in the Jesuit way of life. I did a Bachelors and Masters Degree in Economics from Loyola College, Chennai. I must acknowledge that my journey throughout the years in the Society of Jesus has been very exciting and challenging.

2. What are your hobbies, likes and dislikes? What was your greatest ambition when

you were a teenager? Have your hobbies helped you to fulfill your ambitions?

I enjoy doing small things with great trust in God. I love to learn new things. I love pastoral ministry. Since I love pastoral ministry, I was always committed and went out of my way to serve those people who were in need of my service. I like to give orientation programs to the youth. While doing my Philosophy at JDV Pune, I used to go to various schools giving orientation programs. I love nature. It refreshes and reinvigorates me to do better in life.

3. You have been with us for almost a year. What is the best as well as the worst thing about our institution? What are your plans to make those weaknesses things turn into our strength?

St Xavier's contributes to the integral and holistic growth of every student. Our institution is serious about forming young minds who will emerge as good human

beings. We are producing good citizens for our country. This is what I like the most in our Institution. We need to do more to create a good and harmonious world through our Institution. There is a reason behind every behavior of a child. I will try to help the students to grow fully in life.

4. What qualities of the Jesuit Society urged you to become a priest and live a saintly life? Who is your role model in life?

I had desire to become a priest right from my childhood. I studied in the mission school till matriculation. As a result I came in contact with many Jesuit fathers and brothers who inspired me through their exemplary life. Jesus is the role model of my life. He was a missionary and revolutionary. He lived a life of simplicity and love. He lived his life for others. He attracted crowds, stayed with them, shared his values, criteria and priorities with them. He came down to the valley of our everyday needs, giving light to the darkened world, giving hope to the hopeless, a voice to the voiceless, being a friend to the friendless and giving life to the lifeless. I try to follow him in my day to day life.

5. Being a Vice Principal is a very difficult job. What challenges do you face and how do you tackle them?

I enjoy learning many new things being a Vice Principal. To help the students to shine in all walks of life is a challenge. Some students get defeated easily, give up trying their best. I tell them that nothing can defeat them unless they allow it defeat them. I encourage the students to go beyond their limits and explore their true potential, which is limitless. I tackle problems with a positive attitude towards the situation.

6. According to you what is the basic principle of life that helps a student to become better in every field? What principles have you been following in your life journey?

Simplicity, responsibility, discipline, 'No pain, No gain' are the basic principles that help students to become better in every field. If we don't strain our muscles, they get weak. If we don't strain our brain, our cognitive ability declines. The students need to train themselves to face the hardships of life. Dedication, diligence and hard work help students to achieve success. True success lies in imbibing the right values and nurturing a good heart with love and concern for others.

I maintain a positive attitude, build strong relationships, listen to others and celebrate progress. I'm composed during tough times. I love to live a life of simplicity. I try to avoid negativity. These are certain principles I have been following in my life journey that lead me to a happy and healthy life.

7. Finally, what is your message for the students as well as their parents?

Love yourself and be kind to others. I wish that my students and their parents have an attitude of humility, obedience, service-mindedness and faithfulness. Parents must be the legends of inspiration to others. The students should feel that they are appreciated, encouraged and valued. The students should make their parents proud by excelling in all that they do. Render your service actively and enthusiastically for the good of others.

Interview with Sister Phyllis, Primary Co-ordinator



Q1. Sister, we welcome you to our Xavier Family. Our Xavier Family is eager to know about you and your work experiences in the past few months in the school.

Ans. I really feel honoured to be a part of the Xavier family at this time of my life's journey. In fact it is adding a new chapter in my book of life. Thank you for your warm welcome.

Q2. Sister you are the coordinator of the Primary section. What are the challenges you face in handling the students of the primary section? How do you cope up with these challenges?

Ans. I would like to delve little deeper into this question. Our Primary students exhibit impact of social media, faulty parenting and irresponsible society and all its stake holders. All of us, somehow consciously or unconsciously are involved in the

making of the present scenario. So my outlook is that instead of being part of the problem why not be a part of the solution. With this purpose in mind I am here amidst you. And I know solution lies in each one of us and it's my bounder duty to awaken in each child that everyone is unique individual endowed with divine qualities and immense potential to rise above all odds and establish interconnectedness and learn to respect self and others. My role is to facilitate better relationship among teachers and students for a better ambience for a holistic growth of students and then in turn become ambassadors of social change to bring peace and harmony.

Q3. Sister, tell us something about your religious life. How did you get inspiration to serve as a Sister? Who is your role model?

Ans. I hail from a pious catholic family in the south and my parents instilled in me to have faith in God, self discipline and a sense of responsibility at a very young age which was enhanced during my school days. Sisters, who taught me in the high school played an important role and inspired me to join religious life.

To serve as a sister, my real role model is Jesus and His teachings and secondly our foundress venerable Nano Nagle whose charism continues to live on in the lives of Presentation Sisters.

Q4. Sister, tell us something about your education and your past work experiences?

Ans. After completing my formal education at university level and number of years spent in religious studies, I began to embark on my sacred task of being a teacher and followed by school administration in our own presentation Convent schools. I never stopped studying. Self education was always my Primary agenda, acquired Post Graduate Diploma in psychological counseling and guidance.

Here I would like to appreciate our Indian culture of touching the feet of the elders which is still kept up. It's my first experience dealing with boys in the school.

Q5. Finally, what is your message for the students and teachers? What values should a Xaverian inculcate within oneself?

Album Title: SUMMER CAMP 2018

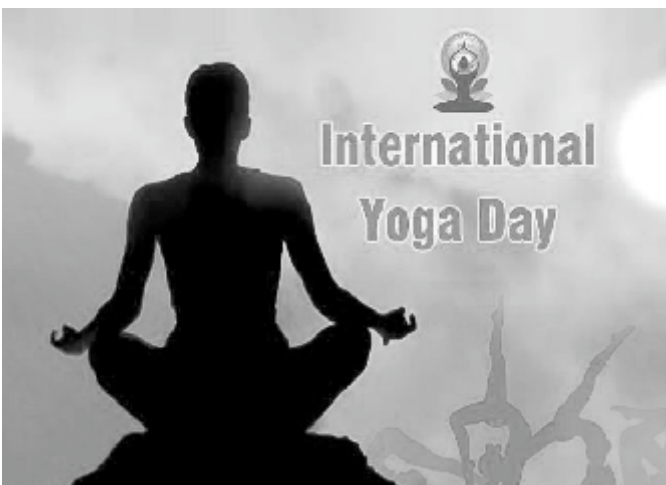

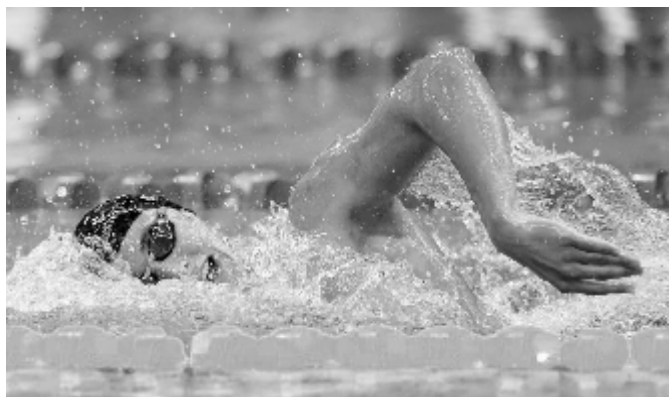

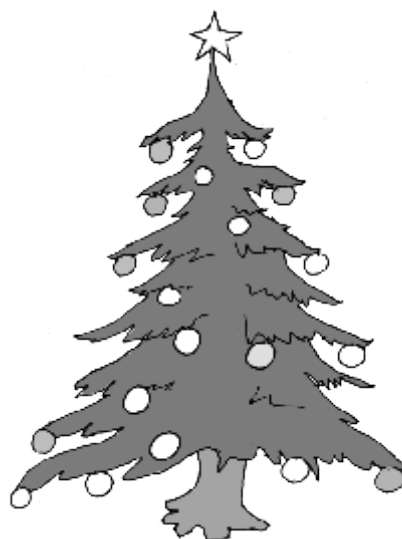

POSITIVE PARENTING



Parent's role is very important and effective in children's psychological growth and behaviour. The foundation of children's social attitude and skills are laid at home. Parenting can be more enjoyable when positive

parent-child relationship is established.

Whether we are parenting a toddler or a teenager, good communication is the key to building self-esteem as well as a mutual respect. Communication is the art of connecting with others, of breaking down walls and building bridges. Parents who communicate with their children, build a strong and healthy relationship. But it doesn't always happen naturally. We must develop some important psychological patterns while communicating with children.

- **Listening to understand** – We want to communicate with our children, but most of us do not “listen to understand” we “listen to criticize”. Instead, we must try to understand the children's point of view and his or her feelings. In this way, we open the door to real communication.

When we get our adolescents to talk, we need to put aside our own purpose and really listen. If we rearrange the letters in the word listen, we can discover an important word of the communication process “SILENT”.

- **Give your undivided attention** — Put down the newspaper, turn off the TV, keep your mobile aside and look at your child when she or he is talking.
- **Listen to the feelings being expressed** — Listen, not only to what is said, but also how it is said, and watch the body language that goes with it. Listening “between the lines” helps one understand the meaning behind the words.

- **Check for understanding** — Never get judgmental by your child's words. Understand his or her feelings and build strong emotional relation.
- **Encourage more talk** — When you really listen, you can almost hear your child breathe, a sign of relief. But this does not mean you always agree with what he or she has said, but you have established an atmosphere of openness and trust. Perhaps your child is now ready for some gentle advice.

Parent's interactions with children are often, tinged with odd combination of tradition, personal prejudice, emotional regard, and rule-of-thumb procedures. It is true that affection tendencies which are so important to psychological adjustment in adult life are dependent on the nature of parent — child relationships. The home is truly the greatest socializing place in all contemporary cultures. In view of the importance of home experience in child's life, it is surprising that most of the children's psychological conflicts turn to traumatic experiences during the first four or five years of age.

Understand the child's thoughts, feelings and beliefs-

- **Changes in emotions-** Adolescent's emotion are stronger and more changeable than any other stage of life. Coping with so many changes, they tend to have extreme mood swings. They are likely to cry, laugh, sulk, argue, become arid or excited.
- **Changes in Thinking** — Young adolescents are better able to think of new ideas and understand abstract concepts. They need proper guideline, direction, and limits.
- **Understand the complex feelings** — Be a role model for your child. Show them that having

difficult feelings is part of everyday life and teach them how to deal with complex feelings. Encourage your child to express his or her emotions in healthy ways such as talking about sad feelings or saying why they may be feeling angry and help them to calm down and move on towards pleasant activities. Remember that children are affected by the feelings, behavior, and interactions of others. Help your child and give support of 'feel good' emotions such as happiness, joy, enthusiasm and positive thinking.

THE MOTHER'S STRONG ROLE IN CHILD

In terms of time spent with the child, the mother has more opportunities than the father to influence her offspring's psychological growth and behaviour. Since child rearing in our culture

is generally recognised as primarily the mother's privilege and responsibility.

One of the effects of this extreme degree of maternal attention is that both boys and girls prefer their mother's presence when they are in personal or social difficulties. So, to be successful at positive parenting, parents must understand the child's feeling. This allows a parent to better know what children are able to do physically, cognitively (with their minds), emotionally (with their feelings), and socially (with their relationships).

With this knowledge, parent's expectations for their children become more realistic.

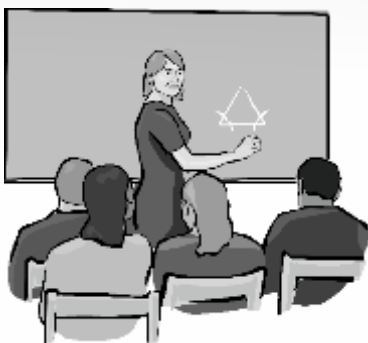

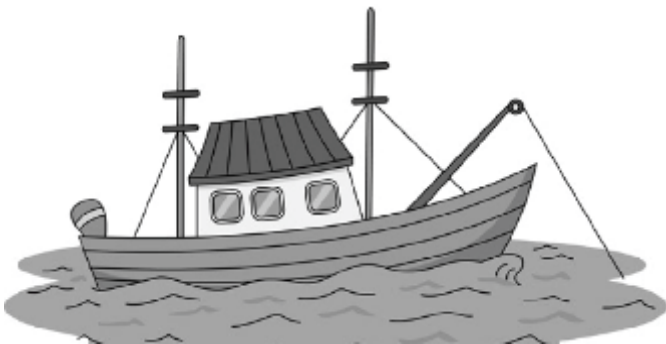

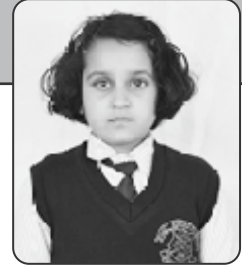

Bal Gangadhar Tilak



Bal Gangadhar Tilak was a mathematician, a teacher and a nationalist. He helped to lay the foundation of India's independence by building a strong opposition to the British rule in a unique way. He along with Lala Rajpat Rai and Bipin Chandra Pal, encouraged people to stop using British or foreign goods and encouraged the use of goods made by Indians in India. They rejected English schools and promoted Indian education. They abandoned British services and asked people to join their movement which later turned into a national movement. Intense agitations were led by Lala Lajpat Rai in Punjab, Bal Gangadhar Tilak in Maharashtra and Bipin Chandra Pal in Bengal. These three leaders were known as 'Lal Bal Pal'. They demanded Swaraj or self - government. In 1914, Bal Gangadhar Tilak founded the India Home Rule

league and served as its president. As a teacher of mathematics in a private school of Poona (Pune), Tilak wanted to educate the people of India. He started publishing two newspapers to awake the consciousness of the people. These two newspapers were Kesari and Mahratta which were published in the language Marathi and English respectively.

The most important of these philosophers was



Parmenides. Parmenides thought that everything that exists had always existed. This idea was not alien to the Greeks. They took it more or less for granted that everything that existed in the world was everlasting. Nothing can come out of nothing, thought Parmenides. And nothing that exists can become nothing.

But Parmenides took the idea further. He thought that there is no such thing as actual change. Nothing can become anything other than it was.

Parmenides realized, of course, that nature is in a constant state of flux. He perceived with his senses that things changed. But he could not equate this with what his reasons told him. When forced to choose between relying either on his senses or his reasons, he chose reason.

You know the expression 'I'll believe when I see it.' But Parmenides did not even believe things when

he saw them. He believed that our senses give us an incorrect picture of the world, a picture that does not tally with our reasons.

As a philosopher, he saw it as his task to expose all forms of perpetual illusion.

This unshakable faith in human reasons is called rationalism. A rationalist is someone who believes that human reason is the primary source of our knowledge of the world.
